

Bowling Promotion Tour 2023 - Masters Series Rules & Regulations:

This year the tour will feature the Masters Series once again and will consist of an 16 single person stepladder which will be the largest single elimination stepladder in the events history to give every bowler a good chance of making at least 1 or 2 TV telecast over the entire Tour.

Masters Qualification:

Bowlers will play a total of 18 games of Qualifying in 3 different Cities across the week breaking down into 3 x 6 Game blocks.

Subsequently the Top 2 players at each stop (6 game total) will play an Exhibition match that will be Live streamed for the viewers to watch and will compete for a bonus of 100 euros for the winner of this match (this will happen after each of the 6 game blocks.

Based on the 18 games of qualifying the top 16 will make the TV shows seeded from #1 to #16. Each match will consist of 1 game pinfall to decide the winner and then that player will move on to face the next highest seed in the following match and so on. in the final match of the stepladder unlike the other matches where it is a one game elimination match the final consists of 2 TV matches with the 2 players competing over 2 games and the total highest pinfall will become the masters champion.

TV Finals rules & format

As any match normally does it will start on the left lane with the higher seed choosing whether they want to start or finish then they will take it in turns throwing back to back frames. This is the PBA style of match play and if there are any questions or queries regarding this Bruno Bidone or Jack Blyth will be on hand to explain the play order.

Tie Breaker Rules:

In the result of a tie in the Masters Series the tie breaker will consist of the players competing in a 9th & 10th frame roll off to decide the winner.

If the tie-break results in to another tie-break situation then each player will play a one ball roll off to decide the winner.
